THE VISION:

To provide, using as a model the family tree of Dr. Martin Luther King, Sr. and his wife Mrs. Alberta Christine Williams King, a living, organic and historical template of how and why family "roots" are established and maintained in order to foster growth and continuity of healthy and sustainable local and global communities.

MISSION

- We will promote the value of discovering, knowing and regarding family history of branches, elders and children.
- We will promote the value of knowing and the liberty to apply a process that will separate harmful family customs from nurturing customs; and why it is important to let go of family traditions that stunt the growth of the family tree.
- We will publish and distribute books, films, social media, music, spoken word and other
 means and methods of communication for the purpose of teaching communities how to know
 and benefit from the history of one's family and village.
- We will use education and awareness media campaigns, community events and coalition building of likeminded advocacy groups to lead people to discover their roots, expecting the outcome to result in restoration of Life, Family, Forgiveness, Faith, Hope and Agape Love in the global community.

GOAL

To educate, enlighten, enrich, enlarge and empower individuals, families, communities and the world so that every person will work and live in an environment conducive to brotherhood and sisterhood that will allow for prosperity, good health and soul satisfaction.

THE BELOVED COMMUNITY

We believe that the "Beloved Community" adopted by the family of Martin Luther King, Sr. and Alberta Christine Williams King extends from the Kingdom of God. The Beloved Community is a place where all people are created to live as a human family, enjoined by the Love of God and the power and principles outlined in the Bible.

In his 1967 Christmas sermon, Uncle M. L. spoke these words: "The next thing we must be concerned about if we are to have peace on earth and good will toward men is the nonviolent affirmation of the sacredness of all human life. ...Man is a child of God, made in His image, and therefore must be respected as such....And when we truly believe in the sacredness of human personality, we won't exploit people, we won't trample over people with the iron feet of oppression, we won't kill anybody."

In the Beloved Community, people are to be regarded and respected with the realization that all people are entitled to human dignity. It is a nonviolent community, where human issues and differences are resolved in an environment of Agape Love and enlightenment.

STATEMENT OF NON-VIOLENCE


In line with Biblical teaching, we unambiguously and emphatically reject violence as a solution to the human crisis. Inflicting harm on any individual or property is not an acceptable way of resolving any social problem the American public and the global community currently faces. We respect and cherish the lives even of those with whom we experience challenges and disagreements.

No person who carries out, intends to carry out, or theoretically justifies any act of violence has any part in our ministry or our efforts. In reaching our goals, we remain committed to the pursuit of life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness and non-violence and will always advance a climate where that understanding is embraced.

OUR CORE VALUES

- We believe that forgiveness, faith, hope and transformational Agape love should be integral components of successful human development.
- We believe that the human race is one family, not to be divided or separated by class or by conditions of birth.
- We believe that the community is the visible expression of generational purpose.
- We believe the viability of a nation and its governance is dependent upon its value of human dignity.
- We believe that civil rights and human rights should co-exist for the purpose of nurturing nonviolent and peaceful outcomes for all human beings.
- We believe in the sovereignty of Almighty God as our Creator; and the sanctity of the human personality.
